

About this Booklet

Since we first published our booklet of Lenten prayer, a lot has changed! At Midday

This devotion may be used before or after the midday meal.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places. *Ephesians 1:3*

Psalm 113:1-4

Praise the Lord. Sing praises, you servants of the Lord; *

O praise the Name of the Lord.

Blessed be the Name of the Lord, *

from this time forth for evermore.

The Lord's Name be praised *

from the rising up of the sun to the going down of the same.

The Lord is high above all nations, *

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:

In the Early Evening

This devotion may be used before or after the evening meal.

A candle may be lit during the following Scripture:

How excellent is your mercy, O God!

The children of men shall take refuge under the shadow of your wings.

For with you is the well of life,

and in your light shall we see light. *Psalm 36:7, 9*

pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven, *

O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed!

Grant this for the sake of your love. Amen.

At the Close of Day

Nunc Dimittis – The Song of Simeon

Psalm 134 – Ecce Nunc

Behold now, praise the Lord, *
